Moving us one step closer to safe dining

From mid-July 2021

Who should undergo the mandatory testing



- All outlet employees at dine-in F&B establishments (including restaurants, cafes, food courts, coffee shops, hawker centres)
- Both part-time and full-time employees
- Including third-party contracted staff (e.g. cleaners)
- Regardless of vaccination status

Testing should be done

EVERY **14** DAYS

Testing via Employer-Supervised Self-Swab (ESSS)



Employees can swab themselves under the supervision of a Trained Supervisor, either on-site at the workplace or virtually.

Costs for the Antigen Rapid Test (ART) kits and supervisor training will be borne by the Government for the first 3 months of the roll-out, until 30 Sep 2021.

Becoming a Trained Supervisor (ESSS)



All dine-in F&B establishments are advised to nominate at least 2 employees per outlet to attend the 4-hour virtual training by HMI Institute



Nominated employees above 50 years old must be fully vaccinated (i.e. received two doses under the national vaccination programme)

Register for self-collection of ART kits and Swab Registration System (SRS) Account at <https://go.gov.sg/fet-registration-food> by 5 July 2021



- Submit one form for each outlet (or unique SFA license) if you have multiple outlets
- The Point of Contact (POC) is responsible for both self-collection of the ART kits and recording of FET results on the SRS



SELF-COLLECTION OF ART KITS

A confirmation email from a third-party vendor will be sent to the company POC with the collection location and date



RECORDING TEST RESULTS ON THE SRS*

Upload the results of the employees' swab tests to the SRS on the same day the tests are taken

* More details on the SRS will be available by mid-July. POCs will receive an email notification when SRS accounts have been set up. In the meantime, submit summary test reports at <https://go.gov.sg/fet-results>

Managing Antigen Positive (AG+) cases



Send AG+ cases to a Swab and Send Home, Public Health Preparedness Clinic (SASH PHPC) for a Government-funded confirmatory Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test.



The employer must issue a referral note and arrange for private transport to the SASH PHPC.



After the PCR test is conducted, the employee must self-isolate at home until the PCR results return.



If the PCR result returns negative, the employee can return to work.



If the PCR result returns positive, the Public Health Actions (e.g. conveyance to the hospital, contact-tracing etc) will commence.
